Children of the Land (Preschool) Call (808) 366-2349

Become comfortable in nature while learning about the wonders of water and explore the mountain trails and special homes of the animals that live in the forest.



Introduction to Nature (Kindergarten) Call (808) 366-2349

Take a sensory exploration of both living and non-living parts of nature while learning to appreciate nature. Hike through the forest, learn how soil is made, and explore a mini stream ecosystem.



Introduction to Plants, Animals and Healthy Habitats (Grade 1) Call (808) 366-6858

Explore the stream and forest in 'Iao Valley while learning about survival needs, food chains, and stream life. Demonstrate ways to help keep our habitats healthy.



Cycles in Nature (Grade 2) Call (808) 366-6858

Examine the importance of five of the main cycles in nature (plant and animal life cycles; nutrient, gas, and water cycles) while hiking, fishing at the stream, and hunting for decomposers. See how cycles are interconnected and how humans are a part of these cycles.

Learn about the importance of wetlands and how adaptation, interdependence, and dispersal play key roles in this ecosystem. Discover the threats to endangered Hawaiian wetland birds and how conservation efforts are enabling their survival.
